## SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

James Camp ("Plaintiff") and Betty Cason ("Defendant"), in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, hereby agree as follows:

Plaintiff and Cason are parties to litigation in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia, Camp v. Cason, Case No. 1:06-CV-1596-CAP (the "Litigation"). In order to avoid the expense and uncertainty associated with litigation, the Parties have agreed to settle their disputes and resolve the Litigation under the terms of this Agreement.

- 1. Cason shall not request the Social Security Number ("SSN") of any applicant for a Georgia firearms license ("GFL") except to the extent that the FBI finger print card seeks any applicant's SSN. In the case of FBI fingerprint cards, Cason may use such cards and leave to the agency capturing the fingerprints what information may be requested or required on such cards.
- 2. Cason represents that she has purged from her records all SSNs associated with firearms license applications.
- 3. Within two days of execution of this Agreement, Defendant shall pay Plaintiff's attorney \$52,500, inclusive of court costs.
- 4. Within two days of the completion of item 3 above, Plaintiffs shall file a dismissal of the Litigation with prejudice, with no costs or other fees to be taxed to any party to the Litigation.
- 5. The Parties release and hold harmless each other and their officers, employees, and agents for any claims that were brought or could have been brought in the Litigation above, and specifically agree that the payment provided for herein resolves not only attorney's fees and costs, but also resolves any and all claims made or that could have been made for monetary relief in this case, including but not limited to the request for relief contained in Plaintiff's Motion for Contempt which is currently pending. This Agreement is intended to resolve all claims for injunctive relief, damages, attorney's fees, and any other relief sought or that could have been sought against Judge Cason either individually or in her official capacity as Probate Judge for Carroll County, Georgia in the lawsuit styled above.
